#### **Year Over Year Comparison**



- Benefits decrease-employees paying more
- Utilities substantial decrease- based on cost savings
- Staffing/Strategic Plan-maintain class size and meet State unfunded mandates
- Transportation-lower cost-rebid services
- Capital Outlay- additional for Safety & Security
- Professional Development more due to State unfunded mandated curricular and evaluation changes

#### **Enrollment Impact**

- Overall trend- decreasing by approximately 30 students for 13-14 school year
- Out of District Placements-increasing
  - No state cap on out of district tuition
  - Lower reimbursements from state
- Consider closing a school?
- School Choice- total 110 students across multiple grades
  - Only accepted grades where available seats, so as not to add sections
- Why is staffing going up when enrollment is going down?
  - Not an even loss across grade levels
  - Down in General Education classroom-Up in Special Education equals level staff number
  - Up in Support Services (2 PT Basic Skills Instructors/Math; 2 PT Nurses; 3 PT secretaries)

### What does that tax rate calculation mean to me?

- Though the net tax levy increase is 0.66%, the tax rate is based on average assessed property values. The average assessed property values are down 3.23%
- Example: 2012 House Value (Tax Assessment): \$100,000
- 2013 Home Value (Tax Assessment): \$96,770 (3.23% decrease)
- 2012 Tax Rate of 1.11 per \$100 of assessed Values
- 2013 Tax Rate of 1.15 per \$100 of assessed Values

#### So

- 2012 Property Tax Dollar Amount: \$1,105.08 (\$100K @ \$1.11 rate)
- 2013 Property Tax Dollar Amount: \$1,112.41 (\$96,770 @ \$1.15 rate)
- Actual Dollar Increase: \$7.33, less than 1%
