<u>Friday:</u> Period 1/Lesson: B students are in person, A and C students Zoom into the lesson

- 10 15 minutes: Core mini lesson
 - This can be recorded for viewing prior to the live session
- 10 20 minutes: Guided practice
 - Student collaboration via breakout rooms
 - Conferencing-small group, partnerships or 1:1
 - Independent work
 - Formative assessment
- 5 10 minutes: Closure
 - Reflection
 - Formative assessment


